February is Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month

Talk About It

Teen dating violence is common. 1 in 11 female and 1 in 14 high school students have reported experiencing physical violence. 26% of women and 15% of men who are victims of sexual assault, physical violence or stalking experienced these behaviors before they were 18.

Some teens are more at risk. LGBTQ+, Hispanic, Latinx, Afro-American and Indigenous youth are disproportionately affected by many types of dating violence. Unhealthy, abusive, or violent relationships can have short-and long-term negative effects, including severe consequences, on a developing teen. For example, youth who are victims of teen dating violence are more likely to experience depression or anxiety, engage in unhealthy behaviors like using drugs or alcohol. Rural youth may be more isolated but they still are at risk for teen dating violence.

Haven House wants to encourage young people and those who support them to talk about healthy relationships and navigate what may be unhealthy or even abusive. We have advocates who can present material about healthy relationships in a fun and interactive way to all audiences. 
Human Trafficking Awareness in Nebraska

Human trafficking always involves a power imbalance or vulnerability created by economic or social disparities. Traffickers will target victims with vulnerabilities such as age, immigration status, lack of education or poverty. Most victims will have other trauma in their lives and traffickers are skilled manipulators. Recent events including the high-profile cases of Jeffery Epstein and Ghislaine Maxwell show us that not all traffickers are males.

In Nebraska, over 37 different cities and towns have had a preliminary investigation of human trafficking. Human trafficking is a crime that occurs just under the surface of society and is done in secret. The nature of the crime makes it difficult to identify traffickers and their victims. Traffickers use isolation and threatening tactics to keep victims from being able to leave. They may groom and convince victims that their relationship is normal and the victim has a choice. Traffickers may also threaten the victim's family.

The Nebraska Human Trafficking Task Force has trained over 6800 citizens on how to identify and report possible trafficking activity in 2021 and hopes to increase that number this year. At Haven House, our advocates continue to train and create awareness because trafficking has been reported in our 5-county service area. Questions? TALK ABOUT IT!

START RELATING BEFORE THEY ARE DATING!

Talk to your tween 10-12 year olds about how they can have healthy relationships. It's important to be open and honest with tweens about respect, peer pressure and personal boundaries.

BE CLEAR ABOUT YOUR EXPECTATIONS.

Make sure young teens know how you feel about disrespect, use of abusive or inappropriate language, controlling behavior, or any forms of violence.

TEACHABLE MEDIA MOMENTS

Use TV episodes, movies, music lyrics, news, social media or the experiences of friends to discuss healthy and unhealthy relationships with your teen.
